Register for Classes

You will be pre-registered for some core courses. You will need to register for the remainder of your Spring 2010 courses before you arrive to campus. Online registration takes place through <https://olr.as.cmu.edu/> beginning November 16.

You will also have the opportunity to add and drop courses when you arrive at Carnegie Mellon in January. However, certain courses fill up quickly, so the sooner you register, the better your chances are of getting into the courses you want.

All INI full-time students must take at least 36 units per semester. The standard course load is 42-48 units per semester.

MSIT-IS Students Spring 2010

You will be pre-registered for:

- 14-786: Info Security Risk Analysis (6 units)
- 14-788: Info to Security Risk Policy & Management (6 units)

You must register yourself for ONE of the following courses:

- 18-730 Network Security (Spring 2010)
- 18-732 Secure Software Systems (Fall 2010)
- 18-733 Applied Cryptography (Spring 2010)

Of the 48 required elective units, 12 units must be a course in ECE or CS that is numbered 300 or above. The remaining 36 units can be fulfilled by any courses in Heinz College or the Tepper School or any courses in ECE, EPP, CS or the INI. All electives must be numbered 300 or above.

Carnegie Mellon Orientation

Carnegie Mellon orientation is an opportunity for you to meet other Carnegie Mellon graduate students and to familiarize yourself with important university offices.

Finding Housing in Pittsburgh

The university does not provide housing for graduate students, but the close proximity of surrounding neighborhoods make finding a place close to campus relatively easy. Tuition and Billing Information

Once INI students are registered for courses, a tuition bill will be generated through Enrollment Services (the HUB). Each semester, tuition must be paid one week prior to the first day of classes. The first tuition payment for students entering the MSIN, MSISTM, or MSIT programs in Spring 2010 will be due by January 4, 2010.

Office Space

Parking at Carnegie Mellon

Carnegie Mellon has several parking lots on campus that are restricted to permit parking. There are also metered lots available, but these fill up quickly. Parking Services has a lottery in August to award parking spots. To enter this lottery, either fill out an application form online (this requires an Andrew computer account user ID and password) or fill out and mail in a paper application. Permits are given out to faculty and staff before students, so not all students are guaranteed parking passes.
